Creating community-specific baseline knowledge through a School Safety/Threat Assessment (SS/TA) lens will enhance SS/TA teams' understanding of gang-associated behavior and methods for prevention/intervention strategies. By the end of this session, your Safety/Threat Assessment teams will have the tools to identify and assess worrisome, threat-related, as well as gang-associated behavior on popular social media applications and other parts of the internet.

All sessions will provide applicable resources for additional support.






